# Dr. John Holaday '66 Credits Iota Iota for Experience in Leadership and Brotherhood

Education does not solely stem from the classroom, and alumnus **Dr. John**Holaday '66 credits lota lota Chapter for instilling leadership skills and providing an environment that sustains growth and values. "The strong bonds you develop with brothers early on grow with time and shared memories."

As an undergraduate, John was head of the ritual committee and involved in many campus charity events. His time as a leader in those positions gave him a unique outlook. "I remember learning how to delegate by sharing responsibilities." Two of the most important contributions lota lota gave John were friendship and brotherhood. "The friends you develop as a Sigma Chi will never be eclipsed by time and distance. You grow up with your fraternity brothers and you grow older with them as well." Some of John's favorite undergraduate memories include football games during the Namath era and the great times after fraternity parties. "We would gather around to sing rowdy songs and build our brotherhood." He also offers advice to undergraduates and young alumni. "Maintain your personal values as you make decisions. Be persistent and have fun, and learn to make a difference and help others."

lota lota allowed John to establish himself as a strong brother and provided a chance for him to test his leadership skills. The value of leadership is not lost on John and he acknowledges the effect those skills learned at Sigma Chi had upon him during his transition into adulthood. "You will make mistakes in the journey, learn from them. A good leader is a good follower; no job is too small and a leader always pays attention to details." He also advises that good leadership is a learned skill. "Often leadership is best learned from follow-ship. Set aside insecurities and build teams through example."

John's passion is building companies in the life sciences and has served as the CEO and chairman of many enterprises. He serves as the managing director and CEO for QRxPharma, a company headquartered in Sydney, Australia. "I enjoy building teams and making a difference in people's lives through entrepreneurship." He received his B.S. in 1966 and his master's in 1968 from the University of Alabama. He continued his education at the University of California, San Francisco and graduated with a Ph.D. in 1976. John serves on many boards, including the Leadership Board for the College of Arts and Sciences, University of Alabama. He was honored with the Algernon Sydney Sullivan Award by the University of Alabama in 2008.
