GENERATIONS OF IOTA IOTA BROTHERS GATHERED AT DEDICATION TO CELEBRATE COMPLETED HOUSE

Construction is complete, and the end result is absolutely spectacular. The new chapter house for lota lota is the talk of campus, and we celebrated our move back to University Boulevard and dedicated our new house on September 7-8. Seeing is definitely believing. Hundreds of alumni, family, and friends attended the dedication ceremony and were overwhelmed at the design, quality, and size of the new house. More of our loyal alumni made financial commitments on the spot, wanting very much to be a part of the success of this project.

We broke ground a year ago, and watching the progress of this house as the months went on was impressive. We've been lucky to be on many e-mails throughout the past year with photo updates and lots of excitement. We're ever grateful to all those who have been involved and put a lot of time, sweat, and energy into this project. Many brothers have spent countless hours away from their families in order to make the new University Boulevard house a reality. To you we say a huge thank-you!

The weeks leading up to the brothers moving in and the dedication celebration were filled with much work and the pressure was unrelenting. By late August as the undergraduates were returning to school, it somehow all came together. The most gratifying moments were the looks on the faces of the guys and their parents as they moved in. What they left in May and returned to in August were two different worlds.

It was a labor of love, with an emphasis on labor. We're proud of the architects and contractors who utilized numerous details that are unique to Sigma Chi and Iota Iota. One of the most remarkable features of this house is evident when you walk in the front door. Everyone is greeted by an impressive grand staircase and the Edgar Earl Garrison Memorial stained-glass window—the same window that was in the original house on University Boulevard and the Jefferson Avenue house. It was professionally restored over the last year and it looks amazing. We were also told by several who had visited numerous other chapters across the nation that our chapter room is the most impressive they have ever seen, including that of the Alpha Chapter at Miami of Ohio. By the time of the dedication in September, the payoff was evident. The undergraduates have done a great job taking care of things and have a distinctive sense of pride in their new house.

Burr is a United States Marine Corps captain and CH-46E pilot/weapons and tactics instructor. Many of the lessons he learned from Sigma Chi translate to his job in the military. "Fraternity life closely resembles military life. The leadership opportunities and structure I gained from Sigma Chi have contributed to my success and made my transition to the Marine Corps easier. The experiences and friendships I made at UA helped me cope with the dynamic and stressful lifestyle of the military." Last year, Burr flew supplies to Japan after the Tsunami hit. One of his fraternity brothers, Josh Ferris '03, was living in Tokyo at the time and Burr was on a ship off the coast helping with the relief efforts.

Life in the Marine Corps had Burr living all over the world, which meant he rarely had an opportunity to get back to campus and visit the house or stay involved much. "I've had the pleasure of staying close with many brothers through social media and e-mail, so hopefully this will help me get back in touch with more of the chapter."

As an undergraduate, Burr's top priority wasn't always attending class, which is something he wishes he could change. "I often spent more time figuring out the easiest way to get a good grade in class instead of striving for a solid understanding of the concepts. I wish I would have focused more on the subjects than the grades."

Some of the best memories Burr has from his time in college come from Sigma Chi. "I treasure my sophomore year, living in the downstairs hall of the fraternity house. My pledge class had a close bond and just about all of us lived in-house that year. We shared some amazing times that I credit for making me a better person. Sigma Chi was a great time in my life. It prepared me for the stresses of the military and gave me the confidence to excel in any situation I was presented with."
