Brothers Giving Back

Last fall was a big semester for lota lota helping the local community. Many brothers have become involved in our philanthropy program, Brothers Giving Back. lota lota is now involved in the local Big Brothers Big Sisters mentoring program, and we donated over 800 pounds of food for Beat Auburn-Beat Hunger. 
Law Firm Run Using Fraternal Ideals Spotlight on Dag Rowe '69

Dag Rowe '69 helps run the Huntsville, Alabama, law firm, Wilmer & Lee, much the same way as lota lota. "You don't 'pledge' jerks, even if they're capable and can bring big client bases. You foster respect, collegiality, teamwork, common goals, and fairness."

This fraternal method seems to have worked for senior partners Dag and fellow Sigma Chi Brother John Wilmer '69. Their firm had seven lawyers in 2000 and has since grown to 30. The two lota lota alumni credit this growth to lessons learned while in Sigma Chi. "John and I don't exploit our firm's young lawyers. We have found this is not just the smart and expedient thing to do, but it is also the right thing to do." Dag believes this sense of right and wrong is something all people can learn from. "That combination is powerful in our law practice and has been historically powerful for our chapter. I hope our young actives never lose sight of this."

As Dag reflects on his undergraduate experience, he remembers Sigma Chi as a large and diverse chapter where he learned how to analyze power structures and figure out who's who and what's what. "I also began to learn how to handle my time and prioritize what I was trying to do. These lessons have helped me immensely in practicing law."

Even with a successful law career, Dag has found time for family. He and his wife, Melissa, have been married for 30 years and have two children, Dag Jr. and Anna. Father and son practice law together at the same firm, and Anna
