# \$2 Million Campaign Announced to Build New Chapter House on University Boulevard

More than \$1.26 Million Raised in Early Commitments from Dedicated Brothers

In 1876, a principled group of college men made the fateful decision to establish the lota lota Chapter of Sigma Chi at the University of Alabama. Today, 136 years later, Sigma Chi remains one of the Capstone's leading and oldest fraternities. The continued success of our chapter and our alumni proves that Sigma Chi has made, and still makes, a major difference in the lives of all brothers who spent some of the best years of their lives at lota lota.

Today, we must focus our efforts on providing the same opportunities for future generations of Sigma Chi brothers at the University of Alabama. Thanks to recruiting the best and brightest men, we have remained competitive within the growing Greek community. However, if you have visited campus in the past few years, you have undoubtedly noticed that several fraternities have built brand new or significantly-expanded chapter houses. The time has come for lota lota to build a modern facility to accommodate the University of Alabama's rapid growth and increased interest in the Greek community.

As we stated in the previous *lota lota Messenger*, the University of Alabama's Board of Trustees approved our plans for the chapter house last July. Due to advantageous construction costs and the ability to open the new house in time for the 2012 football season, we broke ground and began construction on our new home returning lota lota to University Boulevard.

Now that we've begun construction, initial commitments from several dedicated alumni now total \$1.26 million. We aren't surprised that alumni from multiple generations have shown so much support, because we all know that Sigma Chis are life loyal. For this reason, we are excited to announce *The Legacy Campaign for lota lota: Securing Our Future.* To reach our goal of \$2 million, generous and significant support of every brother is needed.

In the coming weeks, you will receive additional information detailing the house project and the ways in which you can help. We all benefited from the legacy of alumni who came before us, and now it is our turn to extend that legacy. # BE A PART OF SIGMA CHI'S FUTURE AND CONTRIBUTE TO THE CAMPAIGN Impact of Iota Iota as Told By Eddie Lumpkin '74
