



### Iota Iota Chapter Initiates 56 New Members, Top 10 in Grades

he men of the Iota Iota Chapter of Sigma Chi experienced great success during the 2019 fall semester. As we move into the spring semester, we are constantly looking for ways to better the chapter. We hope that by the end of this school year we will improve our standing in grades, campus involvement, alumni relations, and philanthropic efforts.

Our chapter is proud to announce that we currently have 170 active members after a successful recruitment in the fall welcoming 56 new initiates. Many of these brothers are involved in a multitude of campus organizations, including the Interfraternity Council, SGA Senate, Greek Ambassadors, Culverhouse Investment Management Group, Greek Programming Board, and many others participating in various honors societies on campus.
